About NSS, Kokrajhar Govt. College, Unit

Village Name & Address: Kakrikhola, Nayekgaon, Kokrajhar, 783370

Kakrikhola is a serene and culturally vibrant village located in **Kokrajhar District**, Assam. Nestled amidst lush greenery, this village represents a harmonious blend of traditional practices and emerging developmental aspirations. It is home to a diverse population, predominantly composed of indigenous communities (mainly Garo community), each contributing to the cultural richness of the region. It is a village located in the Kokrajhar subdivision of Kokrajhar district in Assam, India. It is situated approximately 11 kilometers away from Kokrajhar town, which serves as both the district and sub-district headquarters.

The village covers a geographical area of 262.16 hectares and has a total population of 319 individuals, comprising 150 males and 169 females. The literacy rate stands at 33.23%, with 33.33% of males and 33.14% of females being literate. There are about 62 households in Kakrikhola Saljhar.

The postal code for Kakrikhola is 783370.

The village is accessible via public and private bus services, and the nearest railway station is within a 10+ km distance.

Kakrikhola Saljhar is part of the Kokrajhar district, which has its headquarters in Kokrajhar town. The district occupies an area of 3,169.22 square kilometers.

The latitude and longitude coordinates for Kokrajhar town are approximately 26.401436°N and 90.266701°E.

While specific coordinates for Kakrikhola Saljhar village are not readily available, it is located near Kokrajhar town, and the general coordinates for the area can be referenced.

About Kakrikhola Village

1. Location and Environment:

- The climate is typically tropical, with significant rainfall during the monsoon season, supporting agricultural activities.

3. Economic Activities:

- Agriculture forms the backbone of the village's economy, with paddy being the primary crop.
- o Other activities include small-scale farming, fishing, and livestock rearing.
- o The village also engages in minor artisanal crafts and trade to supplement its income.

4. Education and Institutions:

- o The village hosts schools like **1614 No. L.P. School** and **Kakrikhola G.D.M.E School**, which play a vital role in the education of local children.
- o Efforts are ongoing to improve educational infrastructure and increase literacy rates.

5. Challenges:

- o The village faces challenges such as limited access to advanced healthcare, inadequate infrastructure, and the need for economic diversification.
- o Environmental concerns like deforestation and improper waste management are emerging issues.

6. Developmental Initiatives:

- Community-based programs like the NSS 7 Days Special Camping Programme have made notable contributions to the village's development.
- Plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns, and free medical camps have improved living conditions and environmental sustainability.

7. Connectivity:

 Kakrikhola has road access connecting it to Kokrajhar town, though infrastructural development is still a work in progress.

Detailed Report of the Event

31st March 2023:



The survey was conducted in 250 Households including the neighboring villages. The survey was conducted through a 33 Nos. of structured questionnaires. Before the survey was started the NSS volunteers were grouped and sent in different directions to perform the survey.

Out of 250 households surveyed 53 Nos. of Households fall under the criteria where one or more of the family members falls under the age group between 15 – 29 Years of age and he/she is neither in formal education nor in regular employment. In this 53 Nos. of households, there were 66 Nos. of individuals who falls under the criteria, out of them 32 were Males and 34 were Females. There were some households where more than one or two members of the family fulfilled the criteria of Youths Not in Formal Education and Regular Employment. A Total of 21.2% of youth in that village and nearby villages falls under this criteria.

The NSS team under the guidance of NSS Programme Officer, Mr. Danswrang Basumatary, Conducted the survey successfully by visiting the all households. All the respondents were very cooperative and the volunteers sincerely completed the survey.

Day 3: September 27, 2024 - Cleanliness Drive at RNB Hospital

Day 5: September 30, 2024 - Cleanliness Drive at Baganshali Area

- Location: Baganshali Area
- Activity: A cleanliness drive was held in the residential area, targeting waste from streets and public spaces.
- Waste Collected:
 - o Disposable Waste: 50 kg
 - o Plastic Waste: 7 kg
- Total Volunteers: 33
- Outcome: The drive helped reduce the overall waste in the area, and residents were encouraged to take up the cause of cleanliness.

Day 6: October 1, 2024 - Cleanliness Drive at College Campus

- Location: College Campus (Second Drive)

- Waste Collected:
 - o Disposable Waste: 40 kg
 - o Plastic Waste: 5 kg
- Total Volunteers: 49

• Waste Collected:

Disposable Waste: 30 kgPlastic Waste: 7 kg

• Total Volunteers: 41

• Outcome: The drive led to a cleaner hostel environment and motivated students to keep their surroundings clean. Awareness about waste segregation and disposal was spread among the hostel residents.

Challenges:




