Objective	:The main objective of the NSS Special Camping Programme was to promote community service, discipline and leadership among NSS volunteers while contributing to the development of the adopted village. The camp aimed to create awareness on education, health, hygiene and government schemes through surveys and interactions with villagers. It also focused on improving the school environment through cleanliness drives, repairing benches and desks, wall painting and assisting in classroom teaching. In addition, the programme encouraged environmental responsibility through plantation drives and Go Green activities, while cultural exchange and group activities helped strengthen social bonding and community involvement. Overall, the camp provided experiential learning opportunities that enabled volunteers to understand rural challenges and work together for meaningful social change.

Detailed report of the event:

The seven-day NSS Special Camping Programme of Kokrajhar Government College commenced on **2nd August 2024** at the adopted village school, 1614 No. Kakrikhola LP School, amidst much enthusiasm and community participation. The inaugural session was graced by **Rima Trishna Haloi, ACS, Assistant Commissioner of Kokrajhar District Administration**, as the Chief Guest, who delivered an inspiring speech emphasizing the significance of youth participation in social development through NSS activities. **Dr. Dimacha Dwibrang Mwchahary, Principal of Kokrajhar Government College**, attended as Guest of Honour and highlighted the objective behind organizing such special camps—to instill values of service, discipline and leadership among students. The presence of village leaders, school authorities, teachers, parents and community members created a welcoming atmosphere. The volunteers added a cultural touch to the programme with a graceful **Garo traditional dance**, symbolizing unity and cultural richness. The first day also witnessed a **Free Medical Camp**, which benefitted villagers with basic health checkups and awareness on hygiene and nutrition, thereby successfully marking the beginning of the camp.

On **3rd August 2024**, the camp activities gained momentum as volunteers assembled early morning for a disciplined start with **NSS song, prayer and thought of the day**. After breakfast, they proceeded for Shramdaan, dedicating their effort to **paddy plantation**, contributing to agricultural labour and thereby experiencing rural livelihood first-hand. The

volunteers worked in muddy fields with dedication and teamwork, before dispersing for lunch. The same activity continued in the afternoon, showcasing their commitment. In the evening, the volunteers lined up for **Drill practice**, preparing themselves for the upcoming Independence Day celebration. The day ended on a spirited note with songs, informal interactions and group reflections.

The third day, **4th August 2024**, began with the usual morning ritual of NSS song and tea refreshment, which prepared volunteers for another productive day. A massive **cleanliness drive** was undertaken in and around the school grounds, playgrounds and village pathways, resulting in the collection of around **9.8 kilograms of plastic waste**. This not only contributed to environmental improvement but also raised awareness among villagers about waste disposal. After lunch, the volunteers worked actively on **repairing school desks and benches, painting walls, cleaning classrooms and restoring broken furniture**, making the learning environment more student-friendly. The evening session was a rejuvenating one, filled with **cultural activities, talent showcasing, songs and coordination practices**, which strengthened bonding among participants.

The fourth day, **5th August 2024**, turned greener and more community-centered. After breakfast, volunteers engaged in a **plantation drive** around the school campus and playground, planting saplings and ensuring proper spacing and watering. This activity aimed to develop environmental consciousness among the community. Shortly after, upon request from villagers, they participated again in **paddy plantation work**, extending support to nearby households. Post lunch, a structured group discussion was held with women and youths of the village, wherein volunteers interacted about health, education, livelihood opportunities and social concerns. This was followed by drill practice and preparation for a cultural exchange session. The day closed melodiously with **group singing and NSS song**, creating a harmonious ambience.


On **6th August 2024**, the fifth day, volunteers focused on analytical and outreach work. After the morning routine, they initiated a **door-to-door socio-economic survey** targeting approximately 60 households. The survey included parameters such as literacy status, access to healthcare, family income sources, sanitation facilities, women's empowerment initiatives and awareness on government schemes. The interaction with villagers offered deeper insights into local challenges, making the experience valuable for both students and faculty. After lunch, drill practice continued, followed by an engaging cultural exchange with village youth participants. The day ended as tradition demanded—with NSS song and group reflection.

The sixth day, **7th August 2024**, was devoted to both ecological and educational contributions. The volunteers started with morning assembly and then undertook **Go Green activities**, nurturing planted saplings, clearing weeds and cleaning the school campus. Additionally, they took responsibility for **teaching and assisting school students in academic subjects**, motivating children to improve their learning habits. Afternoon hours were spent rehearsing choreography, songs and group presentations for the upcoming valedictory function. The disciplined drill practice continued, signifying unity and

preparation. The day concluded with discussions, cultural bonding and a feeling of accomplishment.

The final day, **8th August 2024**, was celebrated with excitement and emotions. After morning songs and prayer, the volunteers conducted a **plantation programme** at **Kakrikhola G.D.M.E School**, aligning with the **Amrit Brikshya Andolan-2** initiative, symbolizing sustainable commitment. A brief community meeting was held thereafter, addressing local issues related to road repair, sanitation, drinking water supply, student dropout problems and women safety concerns. This was followed by the grand **valedictory ceremony**, which showcased cultural fusion performances by village youths and volunteers. Distinguished guests including **Principal Dr. Mwchahary**, **Mrs. Murshida Alom (Director of Aaiman Agriculture Farmer Producer Company Ltd.)**, and **Mr. Lipson Sangma (Vice President of All Assam Garo Sahitya Sabha)** graced the occasion with encouraging remarks. Certificates were distributed, appreciation speeches were delivered and the seven-day journey culminated with **NSS song and National Anthem**, marking the conclusion of a camp that transformed both the volunteers and the community through service, cooperation, awareness and shared responsibility.

Detailed Report of the event:

The NSS Unit of Kokrajhar Government College actively participated in the Shramdan activities on 25th August 2024 during the Mental Health Camp held at ANT Campus, Roumari Chapaguri, organized by the ANT, Chirang. A group of 12 NSS volunteers participated in the initiative, their support to multiple service components associated with the Mental Illness Treatment Alliance. The volunteers played an important role in assisting medical professionals, guiding patients, and ensuring the smooth functioning of core activities at the camp.

The Shramdan activities involved assisting medical staff in patient registration, distributing forms, organizing files, and directing individuals to counseling sessions and diagnosis areas. Volunteers supported patients by escorting them to designated sections, arranging seating for elderly beneficiaries, and ensuring that individuals with psychological concerns received patient-friendly guidance. A help desk was managed by the volunteers where queries were addressed, visitor information was recorded, and individuals were informed about the sequence of consultation procedures. They also participated in distributing awareness materials related to stress management, mental illness symptoms, treatment facilities, and psychological well-being.

In addition to operational support, volunteers ensured cleanliness and proper arrangement within working areas, counselling rooms, and waiting zones to create a comfortable environment for both patients and health workers. Their involvement fostered coordination between camp organizers and participants, thereby reducing confusion, improving waiting time management, and enhancing the accessibility of available services.

Through this Shramdan activity, the volunteers gained firsthand exposure to mental health service delivery, strengthened interpersonal communication skills, and developed empathy while interacting with mentally distressed individuals and their families. The initiative highlighted the relevance of youth participation in community-based mental health programmes and contributed greatly to the camp's success. The participation of NSS

volunteers reflected their commitment toward social responsibility, cooperation, and service to marginalized groups, ultimately aligning with the NSS motto “*Not Me But You*.”

Report an "Intensified IEC Campaign," an awareness program on HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)

Event : An "Intensified IEC Campaign," an awareness program on HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs).

Objective : The "Intensified IEC Campaign" aimed to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS and STIs among students by promoting knowledge, encouraging preventive practices, reducing stigma, and fostering community engagement. It also sought to highlight the importance of early detection, regular testing, and access to treatment and counseling services, empowering students to protect themselves and support others in their community.

Outcome : The "Intensified IEC Campaign" successfully raised awareness about HIV/AIDS and STIs among over **250 students and teachers** encouraging active participation through interactive activities and reducing stigma associated with these infections. The program fostered open discussions on sexual health and strengthened community ties, amplifying the impact of HIV/AIDS education and awareness beyond the college.

Detailed Report of the Event:

On **August 29, 2024**, Kokrajhar Govt. College hosted an "Intensified IEC Campaign," an awareness program on HIV/AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs). The event was organized by the Red Ribbon Club (RRC) of Kokrajhar Govt. College in collaboration with the District AIDS Control Office, Kokrajhar, and supported by the Assam State AIDS Control Society. The campaign aimed to educate and raise awareness among students about the prevention, transmission, and treatment of HIV/AIDS and STIs.

The event saw the participation of around **250 students, teachers and members** of the Red Ribbon Club. **Mr. Danswrang Basumatary**, Coordinator of the Red Ribbon Club at Kokrajhar Govt. College, warmly welcomed the gathering. **Dr. Shibu Basak**, Vice Principal of Kokrajhar Govt. College, inaugurated the program with a speech that emphasized the importance of awareness and education in combating the spread of HIV/AIDS and other STIs. The inaugural session set a thoughtful tone for the day's activities, encouraging active participation from the attendees.

Following the opening remarks, **Mrs. Mamuni Bashiya**, Counselor of the PPTCT (Prevention of Parent to Child Transmission) program in Kokrajhar, and **Miss Hirimba Narzary**, Counselor of Care India TI (Targeted Intervention) in Kokrajhar, delivered insightful lectures on HIV/AIDS awareness. They covered various aspects, including transmission modes, preventive measures, the importance of regular testing, and available treatment options. Their lectures were monitored by **Miss Swdwmshri Narzary**, Project


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Manager of Care India TI, Kokrajhar, ensuring that the information shared was accurate and comprehensive.



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Report on “Webinar on World Suicide Prevention Day”

Event Name	: Webinar on World Suicide Prevention Day

Objective: To raise awareness about mental health and suicide prevention, and to provide valuable insights into coping mechanisms, available resources, and the importance of social support in mental well-being.

Details of Activities:

The NSS Unit of Kokrajhar Government College actively participated in a webinar organized by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India through GHS, in observance of World Suicide Prevention Day. The event was streamed live in the Seminar Hall of the college and was attended by 30 NSS volunteers. The primary objective of the programme was to raise awareness on mental health issues, identify signs of suicidal tendencies, and empower volunteers with preventive knowledge and supportive skills.

The webinar began with an introductory session on the significance of World Suicide Prevention Day, emphasizing the need to understand mental health challenges faced by individuals in today's fast-paced and stressful environment. Eminent mental health experts and clinical professionals delivered presentations focusing on early warning signs related to suicidal risks such as withdrawal from social interactions, emotional instability, drastic behavioral changes, feelings of hopelessness, and extended periods of stress and anxiety. Through case-based discussions, the speakers detailed how timely intervention and empathetic communication can help individuals in distress seek support.

The session also highlighted psychological methods and coping mechanisms that could be used both individually and within peer groups. Resource persons underscored that strategies like active listening, emotional validation, stress reduction practices, and timely counselling play a crucial role in preventing suicide. Discussion was further extended to the availability of helpline services, counseling centres, and government-supported mental health platforms, encouraging volunteers to disseminate the information within their communities.

A dedicated interactive session formed an important part of the programme, during which students posed relevant questions pertaining to confidentiality in counselling, preventive actions to support distressed peers, and responsibilities youth should take to break stigma around mental illness. The experts responded with practical guidance and

recommendations, emphasizing the collective responsibility of the community in ensuring emotional safety for vulnerable individuals.

This session proved to be insightful for the volunteers as they gained clarity about their role in mental health advocacy. At the end of the webinar, volunteers shared reflections, acknowledging that the knowledge gained would help them provide peer support, conduct awareness activities, and encourage open discussions on mental wellbeing. The programme concluded with the volunteers committing to disseminate mental health awareness within the college environment and extending help to individuals in need.

The webinar helped strengthen students' attitude towards emotional sensitivity, responsibility, and community well-being. The participation of NSS volunteers demonstrated their commitment towards social causes and contributed significantly to the larger goal of creating an informed, supportive, and suicide-preventive campus atmosphere.


Details of Activities:

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

Report on “Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign 2024”

Event : **Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign**

Date : 25th September – 02nd October 2024.

Objective : The primary objective of the *Swachhata Hi Seva* campaign was to involve the community, students, and volunteers in cleanliness activities aimed at promoting waste management and sanitation across various locations. The campaign emphasized waste segregation, the reduction of plastic waste, and the importance of maintaining a clean environment.

Detailed Report:

A week-long “Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign 2025” concluded on Wednesday with enthusiastic participation from NSS volunteers of Kokrajhar Government College, marking a remarkable contribution towards community cleanliness and awareness generation. The campaign, held from September 25 to October 2, covered multiple public locations including the college campus, railway station, hospital premises, local market areas and residential zones.

Over 280 volunteers took part in the initiative, conducting cleanliness drives and awareness programmes aimed at promoting waste segregation, reduction of plastic usage, and proper disposal of solid waste. The campaign began at the college campus where volunteers removed accumulated litter, collecting 37 kg of disposable waste and 5.3 kg of plastic waste. The drive not only helped beautify the campus but also encouraged students to maintain cleanliness in shared spaces.

The railway station area witnessed significant improvement on the second day, with volunteers collecting nearly 45 kg of waste. Passengers and railway staff appreciated the effort, and several were sensitised towards responsible waste disposal. A similar drive was organised at RNB Hospital where volunteers cleaned open spaces and removed 39 kg of waste, ensuring cleaner surroundings for patients and attendants.

One of the major activities was conducted at the Daily Market on September 28. In a zone known for heavy waste generation, volunteers collected over 56 kg of waste. Shopkeepers supported the effort and were oriented about waste segregation. Cleanliness activities continued at Baganshali area, with residents joining the campaign and learning about sustainable waste practices.

The college campus was revisited for a second cleaning drive on October 1, demonstrating continuity of the mission. The final day was dedicated to cleaning the Boys' Hostel, where volunteers removed discarded food packets, plastic bottles and paper waste from the surroundings.


In total, 281 kg of disposable waste and 40.2 kg of plastic waste were collected during the campaign. Volunteers also conducted brief awareness sessions at each location, urging citizens to reduce single-use plastics and contribute to maintaining clean neighbourhoods.

The initiative concluded with a renewed call for environmental responsibility. NSS volunteers expressed satisfaction at having contributed to a meaningful cause, while faculty members appreciated the commitment and discipline shown throughout the campaign. The week-long effort highlighted the role of youth in strengthening the national movement for cleanliness and sustainability.


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

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

Report on Participation in Mental Health Camp at ANT Campus, RoumariChapaguri

On 29th September 2024, a team of twelve NSS volunteers from Kokrajhar Government College participated in a Mental Health Camp held at ANT Campus, Roumari Chapaguri. - Promoting open conversations around mental health to reduce stigma and misconceptions.


Detailed Report:



Detailed Report:


