1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. About Kokrajhar

Kokrajhar town may be called the gateway to northeast India. Located in a strategic place, often referred to as the 'Siliguri Corridor also known as chicken's neck' (Elevation=34 meters, $26^{\circ}24'$ $18.3''$ N latitude and $90^{\circ}16'$ $33.3''$ E longitude), Kokrajhar connects northeast India with the mainland. At present, it is the headquarter of Kokrajhar district as well as Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC), an autonomous administrative setup under the sixth schedule of Indian Constitution comprising five districts viz., Kokrajhar, Chirang, Baksa, Tamulpur and Udalguri. From a sleepy and insignificant town, this place has grown rapidly over the last few decades. Not so long ago, it was just a Sub-divisional headquarter. From a Sub-divisional headquarter it evolved as headquarter of Kokrajhar district following the bifurcation of Goalpara district in 1983, and then in 1993 this place was transformed as the headquarters of the erstwhile Bodoland Autonomous Council (BAC). Further, with the creation of the Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) in 2003, Kokrajhar became the seat of power of the newly constituted Territorial Council. At present, Kokrajhar is a bustling place. It is not only a centre of political hubbub but, it has emerged as the nerve centre of cultural, literary, sports and intellectual activities. Kokrajhar has evolved into a cultural capital of the entire Bodo community.

Notably, Kokrajhar is a place of rich and diverse cultural heritage, literature, folklore, history, flora and fauna and is blessed with beautiful landscapes. Chakrashila Wildlife Sanctuary, located in the vicinity of the town, is an example. This Sanctuary is home to Golden Langur (scientific name *Trachypithecus geei*), a species that is indigene to the place. Most importantly the hills, rocks and rivers in and around this Sanctuary are steeped in rich myths, legends and folklore of the Bodos. Further, Kokrajhar has produced famous sportspersons and athletes who have brought laurels for the state and the country.

Kokrajhar town has a humble beginning with humble people living in and around the town for generations. But, the simple-minded inhabitants of this place had a noble vision. Therefore, they worked with a missionary zeal for the development of the place and the emancipation of its inhabitants. The rustic people of this place, especially the Bodos, in all times played an important role in taking up the mantle of leadership, in the upliftment of the place and the emancipation of the downtrodden and marginalized communities through the development of language, literature, culture, education, socio-economy and political life. Through thick and thin, both men and women of this area strove towards development through education in all spheres of life of the individuals and community as a whole. Some key factors associated with the geographical location of the place, perhaps, has played a role in the development of this characteristic trait. The place is a confluence of Assamese and Bengali cultures with the Bodos in between them; the Bodos had the advantage to learn from their immediate neighbors and then in turn to apply the experience absorbed for the welfare of their community. For example, Gurudev Kalicharan Brahma brought the Brahma religious movement from Calcutta (now Kolkata), West Bengal and with this began the socio-religious reform movement amongst the Bodo community. This can be termed as the Renaissance period of the Bodo community and the beginning of a tryst with modernity. Late Rupnath Brahma, a reputed litterateur as well as a popular politician of Bodo community during his time, hails from Kokrajhar. He was instrumental in

the upliftment of the subaltern Bodo people. Thereafter, Bodofa Upendranath Brahma, the architect of the new Bodo generation, took up the mantle from these stalwarts. All these instances speak volumes of the visionary astuteness of the people of this area.

1.2. About Kokrajhar University

Kokrajhar University (then Kokrajhar College) was established in 1959 at the heart of the town with a noble vision of bringing higher education to common people in general and the tribal people in particular. When the erstwhile Kokrajhar Govt. College was established in 1959 there were only a handful of institutions of higher education in lower Assam. Moreover, the few that existed were located in far off places like B.N. College at Dhubri, Abhayapuri College at Abhayapuri and Goalpara College at Goalpara. Since at that time road communication was very rudimentary, to say the least, it was well-nigh impossible for the economically weak people of Kokrajhar and its surrounding areas to pursue higher education. Therefore, Kokrajhar University, when it was established, played a vital role in imparting higher education to the socio-economically backward tribal people as well as to other communities in the area.

The founding fathers of Kokrajhar University cherished a noble vision of sustainable development in society through quality higher education. They understood that for a backward and downtrodden society quality higher education should gain priority to overcome the existing social disability. The founding fathers realized that education is the key to enlighten and empower the economically backward people. Developing human resources became their Mission. The pioneering leaders correctly identified the root cause of their problems and adopted measures to ameliorate the miserable condition.

Initially, the University started with Arts stream with the subjects, viz. English, Assamese, Bengali, History, Political Science and Economics. Gradually, subjects like Education, Philosophy, Statistics, Geography, Bodo and Sociology were introduced. The most recent addition of subject to the University is Sociology.

The University offers Higher Secondary, Under Graduate and Post Graduate courses in both Arts and Science streams. At present the University offers Post Graduate courses in English, Bodo, Assamese, Economics, Mathematics, Chemistry and Physics. From the coming academic session PG courses will be introduced in political science, Geography, Botany and Zoology. The University has a plan to introduce PG courses in all other subjects in due course of time. Currently, the University offers Major courses in all the subjects in both Arts and Science streams, namely English, Bodo, Assamese, History, Economics, Education, Political Science, Geography, Hindi, Bengali, Philosophy, Sociology, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics and Zoology.

The University has steadily grown in size and strength from a humble beginning and it has attained a status of eminence in the field of higher education in the state. Ever since its establishment, it has produced illustrious alumni every year. Its alumni occupy influential positions in the society today. In recognition of its distinguished contribution to the field of education and its pivotal role in the socio-political and economic advancement of the region, the Government of Assam has accorded Kokrajhar Government College the status of a State University. This historic upgradation was formally notified through Gazette Notification No. LGL.42/2023/5 dated 15th March 2024. The transformation marks a significant milestone in the academic journey of the institution. With a renewed vision and expanded mandate,

Kokrajhar Government College is now poised to commence its journey as **Kokrajhar University**, a full-fledged institution of higher learning, from the academic session 2025–26. The University aspires to become a centre of excellence in education, research, and community engagement, rooted in regional heritage and driven by contemporary relevance.

At present, there are 119 teaching staff including the guest faculties, one librarian, 49 non-teaching employees serving the University. The total strength of students at present is around four thousand.

The University has a grand master plan for its new campus. Some of existing buildings are incomplete. Plans are afoot to construct new structures after completing the existing ones with the generous help of the government and the well-wishers of the University. At present, the University has got an administrative block, a science block, a library building, and two arts blocks apart from two old blocks of Assam type structure. The administrative block on the ground floor houses office rooms, Registrar's Chamber, Conference Hall and other rooms. On the first floor there are some departmental office rooms, Major classrooms, and the office room of IQAC. The University canteen is located on the front side, adjacent to the University road. The playground of the University is shared by the Kokrajhar District Sports Association. The University has two Boys' Hostels and one Girls' Hostel. The botanical garden of the Botany Department is located in the northeast corner of the campus.

The central library of the University named **Nilkamal Brahma Central Library** after the famous Bodo litterateur and alumni of the University is housed in a spacious building with modern facilities. The University auditorium is named after the eminent Bodo scholar and author Mahini Mahan Brahma and it is housed in the heritage building (Assam Type Block). At present, the library has a collection of 37,635 books, E-Journals through ONOS (13,234 titles of e-journals), DELNET, 30 journals and periodicals (29 National and 1 International) and 10 National and Local Newspapers. The library is fully automated integrated with RFID technology. An internet facility is attached to the library. Apart from the Central Library, each department has a Departmental Library which remains under the departmental head's control.

The University has NCC and NSS Units. Students can enroll themselves soon after their admission. The University has also introduced Scouts and Guides Cell to inculcate into the young minds the nobility of service to the society, to the nation, and to people in time of need. The Extension Education Centre conducts programmes of community interest such as awareness on environmental pollution, epidemic and endemic diseases, the health hazards arising from unhealthy lifestyles and basic education of modern living which includes empowerment of community as well as individual, literacy, quality education, civic responsibilities, etc. The Career- Counselling Cell offers guidance for further studies and job opportunities. The coordinator of the Cell arranges motivation and counselling sessions by inviting experts in the given field. In addition to these, the University maintains a Grievance Redressal Cell to address the grievances of the students and the faculty. Kokrajhar University is known for its cultural activities, music, sports and N.C.C. events. The students' union KUSU (Kokrajhar University Students' Union) represents the student community of the institution and exercises power as enshrined in the University by law. The Union plays an important role in the smooth and efficient functioning of the University. The union organizes co-curricular activities regularly such as Annual Bonjar Festival, Freshers' Social, Sports Events, etc. The Professors-in-charge of different sections of the Union oversee

the activities of the KUSU and constantly encourage the members of the union body to hone their leadership talents. It is noteworthy to mention that a good number of former members of the Union have climbed up the ladder high enough to become influential student leaders, political leaders/ activists and social workers/ entrepreneurs, etc.

The university has a good track record of steady rise of students' performance in their examinations. The number of first division/class in both higher secondary and degree courses has increased substantially. Since its inception, the University has emphasized quality education. Recent trends indicate an impressive improvement in the overall students' performance and total recovery from the derangement in quality brought about by the two protracted students' movements from the second half of the 70s through the end of the 90s in the state of Assam. In this regard, Late Mukul Chandra Brahma, former Principal assumed an important role in initiating the process of recovery of standard in the University.

The track record of the University in sports is laudable. In many university sports competitions, the university has achieved a *numero uno* position. The University athletic team became Champion in the Inter-College Sports Festival held in Pandu College in 1999. Several students of the University have represented Gauhati University and the State at national level football, volleyball and athletics events. NIS football coaches Mr. Pradip Brahma, Mr. Babul Basumatary and Mr. Bidhan Das are the alumni of Kokrajhar University. The University sprinter Mrs. Subhra Chatterjee won two gold medals in the Inter-College Sports Festival held at Nalbari in 1979. She represented the State several times at the national level. The football team of the University was finalists in the Inter-college Football Tournament of Gauhati University held at Gossaigaon College in 2011 as well as in 2016. The NCC troupe has won several prizes both in camping and in the drills performed during Independence and Republic Day celebrations. The National Service Scheme has been active in the University. The NSS volunteers have conducted both normal and special camps in interior places of the neighborhood.

The University has a Bodo Students' Literary Society which was established in 1968. The Society was formed by the conscious students of the time to work for the development of the Bodo language and literature. It can be said that it has played a significant role in developing the Bodo language and literature. The Society publishes the writings of students and teachers in its annual magazine, *Onzima*. Numerous literary pieces published in this Magazine have found a place in the anthologies of Bodo poetry, essays and short stories. The popular short story writer Nilkamal Brahma was once an editor of the Magazine. Since the 1980s the Society has conducted seminars on literary topics by organizing a literary festival in memory of the pioneering Bodo poet Ishan Mwshahary, often referred to as a Bodo romantic poet. The University has a unit of the World Society of Mathematical Sciences, which works to combat the downward trend of students' interest in Mathematical Sciences. World Society of Mathematical Sciences works globally, not just locally in this issue. It may be mentioned that the society was formed by the initiative of the Department of Mathematics of the University. On the 22nd September 2003 the prominent alumni of the University formed an Alumni Association. Sri Prafulla Kumar Hazoari, ACS and Dr. Shickhna John Wary were the founding President and Secretary of the Association respectively. The Association was formed to provide a platform to the alumni for participating in its growth and development. Accordingly, the Association prepared a constitution reflecting the vision and mission of the

organization. Thus, “Friendship, Discipline and Excellence” was adopted as the motto of the Association. The Association has created a trust fund for the welfare of talented and meritorious students hailing from humble economic backgrounds. The Association confers Best *Student Alumni Award* annually to the students securing the highest marks in secondary and degree courses from the University.

To serve the society with a commitment for academic excellence by engaging in research, innovation, holistic development, and by lifting the indigenous and marginalized communities through inclusive and value-based education.

1.4. Mission of the University

1.4.1. Quality Education

The necessity of quality in every domain has increasingly become important in the age of globalization where specialization and competition have become the major determining factors of success and failure. Kokrajhar University has a plan to improve its quality in all aspects to produce competent and successful students. The University has decided to lay special emphasis on the following points concerning quality improvement:

- 1.4.1.1 Effective organization and management.
- 1.4.1.2 Appointment of competent and eligible teachers with good academic careers.
- 1.4.1.3 Entrance test for the students.
- 1.4.1.4 Regular supervision of the classes.
- 1.4.1.5 Assessment of students’ performance and remedial measures.
- 1.4.1.6 Teachers’ self-appraisal for remedial measures.
- 1.4.1.7 Students’ supportive measures etc.

1.4.2. Transforming the University into a Centre of Excellence

Kokrajhar University is committed to response to the global demand for quality and skills-based education for being readily employable in the job market around the world. This upgraded University will never lose sight of its past history of reputation as well as its good sense of striking a fine balance to stay tuned to the present day needs of the society. When it was a full-fledged government college in 2006, its objective was on the road of fulfillment. Today as a university it is more committed to double down its efforts in making things happen for the good of the society.

1.4.3. To extend help towards the promotion and development of a progressive society

The development of a society can be realized only through effective and strategic planning. This can be possible only through a proper understanding of the society and its problems. To find out the root cause of a social problem and apply a remedy to this effect we have to adopt a scientific approach that can yield effective results. University has a commitment of creating a research eco-system in the campus for both Science and Arts faculties.

Kokrajhar area is rich in natural resources and blessed with rich flora and fauna. The faculty

of science has ample scope for carrying out research works on nature and the environment to protect the rich bio-diversity of this region. The establishment of a sustainable relationship between man and nature, promotion of agro-based industries, increasing forest products, study on herbal medicine, etc. can be made.

The University endeavours to push forward with its resources for the maximum benefit of students and society. The University has different Committees/Cells for smooth functioning of the systems in the institution as per the norms mandated by the UGC and the NAAC. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Career Counselling Cell, Extension Education Centre, and Grievance Redressal Cell take care of various issues as per the given guidelines.

NCC, NSS and Scouts and Guides play important roles in the University apart from the students' union. Through these different units, the University has taken up the mantle of nurturing leadership among the student community in different spheres of life, i.e., social, economic, cultural and civic life. These units mould the young minds for a strong personality and for larger national integration as per the changing values and ideas of the world.

2. PROGRAMMES OF STUDY

2.1 Four-Year Under Graduate (FYUG) Programme [8 Semesters]

The University is offering Four-Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUG) as per the NEP-2020 curriculum. The programme consists of 8 (Eight) Semesters, 2(two) Semesters in each academic year. **A student has to select one subject as a Major Course from the category Major Course and one subject as a Minor Course from the category of Minor Course given in the following table.** The other elective and optional subjects such as Multidisciplinary Elective (MDE), Value Added Course (VAC), Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) etc. are to be chosen from of a pool of subjects to be offered during the time of admission or after the commencement of classes as and when the concerned university notifies for the same. The detail structure of the course can be found at Kokrajhar University website.

2.1.1 Eligibility criteria

Only the students who have secured 45% in aggregate and 45% in the concerned subject in which the student wants to take the Major Course in the Class-XII Board examination are eligible to apply for a Major course. The selection process will be strictly on a merit basis.

2.1.2 How to apply

Students aspiring to take admission must apply through e-Samarth portal. The link of the portal is – <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/>

To apply for admission in the FYUG programme, students have to register themselves first in the portal and then they have to follow the instructions given in the portal.

2.2.1 Admission Policy

The admission to the PG Courses is done as per rules and guidelines of Kokrajhar University updated from time to time.

2.3 Four-Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) under the NCTE

The National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) has approved the University to start Four-Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) for Arts Stream **from the session 2025-26 with an intake capacity 50**. The course will be as per the NCTE guidelines. It is a dual degree course, B. A. + B. Ed. Moreover, it gives the learners an opportunity to acquire a Major in two subjects, one in Education and the other in the subject chosen by a student during admission apart from Education. After successful completion, the students will be eligible to apply for a teaching job

in a school through TET/CTET etc. Moreover, after successful completion, the students will have the opportunity to take admission a Master's Degree in both the subjects, Education and the other subject chosen during the time of admission subject to fulfilment of the conditions laid down by the university as well as by the NCTE from time to time.

Admission is granted through a national-level entrance test conducted by the National Testing Agency. The admission process is carried out strictly in accordance with the guidelines framed by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). The advertisement for the entrance test is usually published in **February**, and the examination is conducted in **April**. Aspirants are advised to regularly visit the NTA website for updates.

There shall be a **Sessional/Unit Test Examination** for each semester. A student shall be allowed to appear in the Sessional/Unit Test Examination provided **the class attendance of the student during the prescribed period is not less than 75%**.

- The subject-wise class attendance of all the students will be displayed in the beginning of the subsequent month.

Further, a student shall be allowed to fill up the forms of the Semester End Examination provided:

- His/her class attendance is not less than 75% during the whole period.
- He/she appeared in the Sessional Examination.

3. ADMISSION POLICY

3.1 General Policy

The University caters to the need of the 6th Schedule (Constitution of India) area. Hence, 60% of seats are reserved for S.T. (Plains & Hills) and 40% seats for Open, OBC, SC etc., as per the rules of Govt. of Assam.

3.2 Reservation for extra-curricular & special category

3.2.1 Name of different Categories

To encourage students in extra-curricular activities, the University entertains special quotas in:

- Sports
- Culture
- NCC
- NSS
- Scouts & Guides

3.2.2 Reservation Policy under a special quota

For each course in the FYUG Programme, the maximum number of reserved seats under special quota are as follows:

Sports: 2%, Cultural: 1%, NCC/Scouts/Guide: 1%, Wards of University Employee: 1%

3.2.3 Admission Policy under a special quota

- ❖ Outstanding sports person / cultural artists/ NCC cadets / Scouts & Guides who have records of representing the country in National/ International Meet will be admitted directly without considering the cut-off mark/credit point. However, the number of

reserved seats in a particular field will not be increased for adjusting more candidates of such category.

- ❖ Sports person will be selected from those disciplines which are recognized by the governing authorities of various sports e.g., IOC/IOA in case of athletics, FIFA/AIFF in case of football, ICC/BCCI in case of cricket, etc. and also such sports which are included in BU Inter College Meets and All India University Meets.

3.3 Selection of Students for Admission

Admission is strictly merit-based, determined by marks obtained in the qualifying examination (H.S. Final or equivalent). Selection of candidates for admission will be done by an admission committee headed by the Registrar, the committee being constituted by the University authority. The decision of the Admission Committee in the selection of candidates shall be final and binding.

The committee prepares the merit lists separately for each category.

3.4 Criteria for Selection of Candidates for FYUGP Major Course

Candidates are selected in order of merit maintaining the University reservation policy for each Major Course separately. For this purpose, a separate merit list is prepared for each Major Course from among the applicants based on **CREDIT POINT (described in detail in Para 3.4.1)** system adopted by the University.

However, departments are allowed to conduct qualifying test for selecting candidates for Major Course in their respective subjects. In such a case there is no cut off mark for applying Major Course in those subjects.

4. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

4.1 How to Apply

- a) A student seeking admission to the University has to register online by visiting the e-Samarth portal/website and they have to follow the instructions as per the portal.
<https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/>
- b) A candidate can apply up to **six times** in the system, hence candidates applying for different Major Subjects, **must apply online separately**.
- c) Students who passed before 2025 will not be eligible for admission and those who passed in 2025 have to furnish a gap certificate from any of the following, whichever is applicable:-
 - (i) *Medical Certificate from a Government Medical & Health Officer on genuine medical grounds, and*
 - (ii) *Gap Certificate from CO/BDO/Chairman Municipal Board, on genuine financial constraints.*
- d) Candidate must produce all original documents from H.S. (XII Board) onwards during the time of admission at the University.
- e) **Candidates seeking admission under FEE WAIVER SCHEME must have to produce INCOME CERTIFICATE/RATION CARD from the concerned officers.**

4.2 How to get Admitted

- (i) The name of the selected candidates will be prepared department-wise by the admission committee and notified in due time and the selection list will also be available online in the E -Samarth admission portal (<https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/>) and University website. **The selected candidates will have to accept admission offer through login to student E Samarth account.**
- (ii) Selected candidates are to get themselves admitted on the fixed date and time by paying requisite fees, failing which his/ her seat shall be forfeited. The seat so available shall immediately be allotted to the next candidate in order of merit from the merit/ waiting list.
- (iii) In case of a student gets selected for two or more Major Courses, as soon as the student is admitted in any one of them, the other options will automatically get cancelled.
- (iv) If a forged document submitted by a candidate is detected even after admission, the admission will stand cancelled.
- (v) The admission committee (Selection Committee) has every right to refuse admission if the candidate fails to produce the original documents at the time of verification.
- (vi) Admission to Hostel(s) shall take place along with the Program admission or at a later date to be notified in due course.

N.B.: *Canvassing in any form to obtain a seat will lead to disqualification of the candidate.*

4.3 Important Points to Note

- Admission into the University is strictly on MERIT BASIS.
- The Medium of Instruction is **English**
- The admission process is strictly online; no offline Admission will be entertained.
- Attendance **in 75% of the total classes** held (lectures delivered) by the students in each subject is compulsory as per the University regulation.
- Accreditation of credit/honour points for class attendance as per specified ranges.
- Display of percentage of attendance of the students for all classes by HoDs of all departments on monthly basis.
- Minimum two Unit Tests / one Sessional Examination for all the classes to be held in due course as per the academic calendar.
- Sessional examination is a component of the Internal assessment marks and each student has to secure minimum qualification marks in the Sessional examination.
- *Wearing any dress other than the prescribed uniform is forbidden.*

4.4 Check List

- ***Read the instruction in the prospectus carefully before filling up the form.***
- **Please check-**
 - (i) Whether you have uploaded the following documents with the application form-
 - (ii) Marks Sheet/ grade card of the qualifying examination.
 - (iii) Pass Certificate from the institution from where you have passed the qualifying examination.

 - (v) Sports/NCC/Scouts & Guides/Cultural (proficiency) certificate*
 - (vi) Gap Certificate from competent authority as prescribed if you have passed in 2025.
 - (vii) PH/VH Certificate (Wherever necessary)
 - (viii) Whether you have filled up all relevant columns.
 - (ix) **Income Certificate/Ration card from the competent authority, if applicable.**

Note: - The University reserves the right to reject applications that are incomplete in any respect.

4.5 Identity Card

On being admitted to the University, each student will be issued one identity card. For this purpose, students shall have to furnish the information as sought in the Bio- data **Format that will be provided during the time of admission.**

5. EXAMINATION RULES

5.1 Attendance

Attendance in class is compulsory.

Students of each class who do not attend at least 75% of the classes held in each subject will not be allowed to

- (i) appear in the sessional/unit test examinations
- (ii) fill up the forms of the final examinations conducted by the Kokrajhar University.

There will be credit/ honour points for class attendance for FYUGP Semester System.

5.2 Unit Test/Sessional Examinations

There will be a minimum of two Unit Tests/ Sessional Examinations for all classes to be conducted by the University/ or departmentally by the respective departments for evaluation/ internal assessment of the students. Moreover, monthly test for all Honours Classes will be conducted departmentally by all the departments. Also, class tests, tutorials and endowing of assignments/ term papers for all classes will be conducted by the respective departments. Attendance percentage, cumulative marks of test/ sessional examination, and internal assessment marks will decide the result of the examination and allowing a candidate to appear in the Kokrajhar University Examinations.

However, the eligibility for filling the forms for the Semester End examinations of FYUG classes will be decided based on the required percentage of class attendance and appearance in the two sessional examinations of the candidate.

6. UNIVERSITY UNIFORM

Considering the significance of UNIFORM DRESS CODE in maintaining the discipline and excellence of educational institutions and in promoting the spirit of congeniality in a centre of learning, Kokrajhar University authority has introduced uniform dress code w.e.f. 2010-2011 academic session. The following is the detailed prescription concerning the colour/combination of the dress materials:

N.B.: Under no circumstances, students will be allowed to wear dresses other than the prescribed uniform during class hours.

7. LABORATORY FACILITIES

The University has eight departments which offer subjects having practical lessons. All the laboratories of these departments are well equipped with the necessary instruments for performing the practical lessons under the syllabi of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Kokrajhar University. Some of the features of the laboratories are mentioned below.

7.1 Department of Botany

The department

- is well equipped with digital equipment for Physiological, Microbiological, Ecological, Cytogenetical and Anatomical Studies for a better and high precision result;
- has a classroom with audio-visual teaching aids;
- has a herbarium with a good collection of plant species;
- has a museum with a good collection of rare plants Specimens;
- has a Departmental Library with a good collection of text books, reference books;

7.2 Department of Chemistry

The department is well equipped with four laboratories, one for HS and three for undergraduate level, and has an audio-visual teaching facility. Some sophisticated modern instruments of the departmental laboratory include-

- UV-Visible Spectrophotometer,
- Flame Photometer,
- Research Polarimeter,
- Digital Conductometer,
- Digital pH meter,
- BOD meter,
- Water Testing Kit,
- Temperature variable hot air oven and water bath shaker,
- Electrical heating instruments,
- Electronic instruments like digital balances, melting point apparatus, distillation plant etc. with the help of UGC and DST, Govt. of India. Laboratories are connected with an uninterrupted power supply system.
- Audio-visual teaching.

7.3 Department of Computer Science

The department has two well-equipped computer laboratories having 40 (forty) computers with Internet, Audio-Visual and AC facilities. The practical of Mathematics, Physics and Statistics departments are regularly held in the laboratory of Computer Science as per syllabus.

7.4 Department of Education

The department is highly equipped with a separate psychological laboratory having various instruments like Mirror drawing, Maze learning – electrical and non-electrical, Memory Drum, Bhatia Performance (Intelligence Test), Tachistoscope (for the span of attention) etc.

Both Projected and non-projected teaching aids- like a computer, LCD projector, models of sense organs – Brain, eye, Ear, Nose, Tongue, etc. are available for classroom instruction. To cater to the needs of students along with the above audio- visual aids and instruments, the department has a well-equipped library with a good collection of textbooks, reference books etc.

7.5 Department of Geography

The department is equipped with a separate computer lab, having access to the Internet, G.I.S., G.P.S. L.C.D. Projector to fulfil the need of the student's community. The departmental library has one of the largest collections of books in the lower Assam. Apart from the class teachings, the students are given to understand hands- on training and practice with various instruments. Field surveys are conducted regularly as per the directions of the parent University.

7.6 Department of Mathematics

The department of Mathematics of the University is equipped with a computer laboratory capable to cater 24 students at a time having been installed Original up to date latest version of Mathematica Software which can be used by mathematics honours students for their skill enhancement course. This software can also be used for research purposes for doing programming language and solving very complicated problems in differential equations along with their graphical representations. Further, Original MatLab Software is also available for doing practical work related to the course curriculum. Latex software which is an open-source software is also available in each computer for the typesetting of complicated mathematics expressions.

7.7 Department of Physics

The department of Physics of the University is assisted by the Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India. The department has one laboratory for the H.S. course, while for the degree course it has four laboratories. These laboratories are named as (a) General Laboratory (b) Electronics Laboratory (c) Dark Room and (d) Semi Dark Room Laboratory (e) Nuclear Physics. The department has three sets of 4-trace dual input CRO and Function Generators in working condition. Besides it has got

High precision digital balance, spectrometer, Platinum resistance thermometer, Bi-prism set up etc. The department is fully capable of catering for the needs of the students of both Honours and General in practical syllabi as prescribed by the affiliating university.

Moreover, to facilitate the students prepare their presentations, the department has one desktop, one laptop, one overhead projector and one LCD projector. The department has a well-equipped library with more than 550 titles in its possession, which is specially used by the Honours students.

7.8 Department of Zoology

The Department is fully equipped with the most sophisticated instruments, not only for carrying out normal practical classes but also for research work. Some of the advanced instruments are over Head Projector, Computers, LCD Projectors, Trinocular Research Microscope, High Precision Centrifuge (Temperature regulated), Digital Water & Soil Analysis kits, Digital Dissolved Oxygen Meter, Thermal Cycler for polymerase chain Reaction, Electrophoresis (vertical and horizontal), BOD incubator, Kymograph etc. Two Minor Research Projects have been completed in recent years under the department.

8. OTHER FACILITIES

8.1 University Library

The University maintains a well-stocked library of 37,635 collections containing entire sections devoted to every subject and free H.S. Textbooks provided by the Govt. of Assam. The library has Wi-Fi Internet connectivity for use by the students and the teachers. The Library is fully automated and integrated with Barcode Feature, QR Code and RFID technology. The University library provides E-Journals through ONOS (13,234 Titles of E-Journals), DELNET and Periodicals on various subjects and 10 newspaper titles. The library has a reference section that houses the journals, encyclopedias, past years' question papers of the University for Reference Purposes. The reading room attached to the library subscribes to a large number of magazines and newspapers both regional and national. There are books on all subjects. Students can borrow books from the library for a prescribed period. The University provides book bank facilities to the poor students. The University Library has a full-fledged Automation with Internet facilities for the users without any extra charge. There are more than 30 computers for students' use. Internship for library is also available. Moreover, the library is fully equipped with research environment with research-supporting software. The library also accommodates Language Lab cum reference Library and digital library. The library has the reading capacity of 150 students.

8.2 Students' Day Home

The University has a separate building for accommodation and convenience of the students during the day time having "Off Periods". Known as the STUDENTS' DAY HOME, the building has a well-ventilated recreation hall with a sitting capacity for approximately 150 students. The recreation hall facilitates the game of table tennis with all the requirements needed for the purpose. The students can also opt for reading different newspapers of regional and national publications. The Day-Home houses two separate common rooms for the boys and girls with the facility of attached washrooms.

8.3 Students' Distress Fund

There is a Students' Distress Fund in the University to provide monetary assistance to the students in distress. This is a subsidiary fund maintained and controlled by the Registrar of the University.

8.4 Hostel Facility

The University has a hostel facility for boys and girls with limited seats. Hostel seats are allotted at the time of admission based on merit. Students seeking admission to the hostel need to show their preference in the Admission Form at the time of submission of their applications.

The University has two (2) hostels for boys one for HS students (25 seats) located in the University campus and another for degree students (34 seats) located in South Tengapara/Habrubari.

The University has one hostel for girls (82 seats) which is located near the north-eastern corner of the University/KDSA field.

The University provides minimum facilities in the matters of utensils, furniture, newspapers but not electricity bulb to individual students for study/ reading purposes.

Details of hostel rules and regulations, management system and mess system are elaborated in the Hostel Bulletin, which is provided to the selected candidates during admission to the University.

The University campus is Wi-Fi enabled and all the students can avail the facility at the respective departments, for educational purposes exclusively.

8.7 Essential Facilities

The University provides all the mandatory facilities for the students like Special ramps and wheelchairs for differently-abled students, emergency medical supplies like First-Aid Box, Stretcher etc. Fire extinguishers, monthly medical check-ups for hostellers, safe drinking water facility, washrooms etc.

8.8 JMCMS Studio

Journalism, Mass Communication and Media Studies (JMCMS) has a well-equipped media studio designed to provide students with practical exposure and professional training. The studio is equipped with cameras, camcorders, advanced editing facilities, a green screen setup, microphones and other essential production tools. It offers hands-on training in video production, editing, audio recording and anchoring, guided by experienced faculty/professionals. The learning experience is further conducted through practical sessions integrated into the curriculum, along with field visits and industry visits that provide real-world exposure. This approach ensures that students develop both technical expertise and creative skills required in the media industry.

9. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND EXTENSION SERVICES

9.1 NCC

The University has a full-fledged NCC (National Cadet Corps) unit. The unit has been arranging different programmes from time to time to inculcate a feeling of patriotism, brotherhood and self-confidence in the cadets. Willing students are imparted necessary training under a trained officer.

9.2 NSS

As part of the programme of National Social Service, the NSS (National Service Scheme) unit of the University was established in 1971. By this time the unit has launched many developmental projects and successfully executed them for the development of roads and communications in the interior places of the district. With a mission to render Social Services students are welcome to join NSS.

9.3 Science Society

Kokrajhar University Science Society (Erstwhile Kokrajhar Govt. College Science Society) was established in the year 1969 with the mission to take science education to common people and to create among them awareness about Environment, Health, Hygiene and to promote interest in maintaining a decent life free from health hazards. Kokrajhar University Science Society is playing a significant role in this regard.

9.4 Consultancy, Career Counselling & Placement Cell

Consultancy and Career Counselling Centre has been introduced in the University with the aim and objective to counsel the job seekers about the courses available to build a future career.

9.5 Scouts and Guides

To infuse in the participants, the ideas of Nationalism, Patriotism, sense of belongingness and to create awareness about discipline, self-help, co-operation, understanding and fraternal feeling among themselves, one Scouts and Guides unit has been established in the University. Interested students may enroll their names with the units.

9.6 Extension Education

The University has opened an Extension Education Centre to carry out activities related to the public and development of general interest in contemporary affairs, giving training for professional skills development, functional literacy and numeracy programme, formal and non-formal education. The goal of this centre is to give higher education more social relevance, building bridges between practical fields of work and learning and involving the institution in the development of a community.

9.7 Sports Club

The achievements of the University in sports are remarkable. Both in outdoor and indoor games students of the institution have brought Laurels year after year. The College (now Kokrajhar University) play a key role in the inter-college tournament of Gauhati University. The College (now Kokrajhar University) team won the championship in football as many as 8 (eight) times. There are facilities to train the budding athletes in both outdoor and indoor games. The University runs a sports club under the guidance of the following teacher-in-charge

9.8 Cultural Activities Centre

Kokrajhar University is famous for cultural and traditional activities, where students and teachers alike take pride in maintaining and taking an active part in these. The University authority to encourage the students in this regard has opened a Cultural Activities Centre. Interested students can associate themselves with the centre.

9.9 Debate Club

To improve the debating skill of the students of the University, a debate club has been established comprising of students and teachers. The debate club holds debate competitions periodically by organizing state, national and international debate competitions.

9.10 Alumni Association

The University formed an Alumni Association with the ex-students, intending to coordinate past and present students of the University to bring about a synergy between the two for the glory of the University.

9.11 KUBSLS

There is a literary society named **KOKRAJHAR UNIVERSITY BODO STUDENTS' LITERARY SOCIETY (KUBSLS)** to provide a platform to the students to indulge in literary and cultural activities in Bodo language, literature and culture. Every year under the aegis of KUBSLS the University holds a literary and cultural festival in memory of renowned Bodo poet Late Ishan Mwshahary called “**ISHAN MWSHAHARY GWSWKHANG FWRBW**” wherein participants from various University are invited to participate in the festival.

9.12 Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The University has a cell with the above name that works towards ensuring continuous improvement in the entire operations of the University. It covers the entire stakeholders connected with the Higher Education namely parents, the teaching staff, the employer, different funding agencies as well as society in general for improvement of the quality and probity.

9.13 IGNOU

The University has the facility of distance learning offered by its study centre, IGNOU. With the expansion of industrialization and urbanization, the traditional modes of learning have become inadequate and the new technique of learning has become imperative. IGNOU is one of such modern devices of education that was established in 1986 on a national basis to cater to the wider needs of a population of all walks of life. Candidates aspiring for higher education other than conventional one may choose for distance learning through IGNOU.

The centre provides courses in – BPP, BDP OR B.A., B. Com, BTSCTS, M.A in Hindi, English, Economics, Political science, Public Administration, History, Rural Development & Commerce.

9.14 Environmental Studies/Education Cell

The cell conducts all the Classes/ Fieldworks/ Examination works concerning the compulsory subject of Environmental Studies/Education.

9.15 Psychological Counselling Cell

The University has a Psychological and Counselling Cell for students' psychological counselling.

10. STUDENTS' UNION

There is a Students' Union in the University known as **KOKRAJHAR UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' UNION (KUSU)** to train and inculcate the students in the democratic spirit, norms and practices as well as to maintain healthy academic standards in the University and to generate healthy competition among the students' community.

The KUSU is a nodal interface between the teachers and the students of the University and more importantly a platform for the students to channelize their energy. It is tasked with certain specific activities like organizing festivals and events like Annual Bonjar Festival, Fresher's Social, Social Work, Outreach Programmes, etc. The objective of these activities and programmes is to infuse healthy interaction amongst the student community and showcase their talents and creativity.

Every bonafide student of the University is a member of the Students Union. The Union has its own Constitution. Its actions, activities and also the office bearers are governed by the Constitution. The Executive Body of the Union is elected by the students (bonafide and regular) from amongst themselves for a term of one year, through a free and fair election held annually. The details of the categories of members of the Executive Body are specified in the Constitution of the KUSU. The Union conducts different extra and co-curricular activities for the students of the University under the active guidance of the respective Prof.-in-Charges.

11. DEPARTMENTS AND FACULTY MEMBERS

The University has at present 119 number of teaching (Arts & Science) faculty members including the contractual/guest faculty members. In its sixty years of service to the society, it has had a galaxy of reputed teachers in its rolls whose dedication have served to enlighten a large number of people of this area who in turn have brought several laurels in different walks of life.

In keeping with its vision of providing quality education to the downtrodden masses of this region, the University has consistently striven to bring the best minds in the respective subjects/ area of study. The departments are run by highly qualified and experienced faculty and supporting staff who are specialists in their respective areas. It is because of their untiring effort and dedication that many talents have moulded themselves into knowledgeable and skilled human resources in different areas required for the development and progress of a healthy society.
